## INTRODUCTION

---

Since the advent of the “recycling law,” the Municipal Waste, Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act (Act 101) that was enacted in 1988, we have attained a recycling rate in Bucks County of about 35 percent. The legislation addresses the residential recycling of paper, food and beverage containers (glass, aluminum, steel and plastic) and many materials generated in commercial establishments. However, there are still many products and materials that can be reused and recycled that are not addressed by the legislation.

The *Guide to Recycling in Bucks County* was first published in 1997 during a time when recycling efforts had attained great success. Curbside recycling programs were in place and the amount of material being discarded into the municipal waste stream was significantly reduced. As a result, many people were searching for ways to divert even more material from the waste stream that were not typically part of the curbside programs. In response to these inquiries, this guide was developed to provide suggestions that would aid in the reuse and recycling of many products and materials. These materials typically require the ‘owners’ to take it upon themselves to locate a facility or program that will accept such items for reuse or recycling. This guide was designed to assist them in doing that.

Now, almost eight years after the preparation of the first *Guide to Recycling in Bucks County*, it is necessary to update it in order to include new information on where many products and materials may be taken for reuse or recycling. Whether measuring by the number of units or total weight, one waste category in particular has increased at a greater rate than any other - electronics. Old computers and their peripherals, televisions, and cell phones are being disposed of at an alarming rate. The National Safety Council estimates that by 2007, Americans will have discarded as many as 500 million computers. Due to the hazardous components in many electronics, most notable being lead, old computers and portable televisions have now become a regular part of Bucks County’s household hazardous waste collection program.

Many household materials are considered hazardous and are no longer permitted to be disposed in the local landfill. Therefore, individuals who chose to purchase these materials need to accept some of the responsibility for their proper disposal. Whether it is that next computer, cell phone, or a non-recyclable helium tank to fill a bouquet of party balloons, the ultimate disposal of that product should be considered prior to its purchase. We cannot expect that “they” will provide a ready means of disposal for a product just because its owner is ready to dispose of it. There may not always be a readily available facility to accept our particular waste.

The *Guide to Recycling in Bucks County* is designed to provide information and ideas on how and where to properly recycle, or dispose of, if appropriate, a variety of materials typically generated from residences that, at the very least, are reusable or recyclable, but may also have potentially harmful impacts on the environment if they are simply thrown into the regular trash.

Included in the guide is information about:

- what to do with old motor oil and antifreeze
- what to do with old tires
- what is the best way to handle “sharps” (syringes) produced in the home?
- what should I do with my old computer?
- should I recycle all household batteries?
- how to properly dispose of old appliances
- what to do with a variety of other hard to recycle items

It is not expected that this guide will provide the answer for every possible material that finds its way into the residential trash. But it will help in providing some direction on how to handle many of these products and materials.

The information will provide you with some specific ways to recycle materials that may have been considered nonrecyclable as well as cause the reader to reevaluate their current buying habits. A review of this guide will also show that some items, due to their hazardous characteristics, need to be stored until the next household hazardous waste collection program. So, for example, buying only what you need of a product for the job at hand is important.

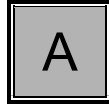

# RECYCLING FROM "A" TO "Z"

## Recycling and Disposal Alternatives for Various Household Materials

---



### ➤ Aerosol Cans

#### *Empty*



- Many curbside programs will accept **empty** aerosol cans in with the commingled recyclables. Contact your hauler or municipality for details.
- If not recyclable - dispose of in regular trash.

#### *Not empty*

- Use up according to label instructions, and, if applicable, recycle can as above.
- Donate to a local organization, if contents are usable paint (i.e. local Theater groups)
- See "Household Hazardous Waste"

### ➤ Ammunition/Explosives

#### *Small Caliber*

For suggestions on how to safely dispose of small caliber ammunition call your local police department or check the Yellow Pages of your telephone directory under "Guns & Gunsmiths." Some gun shops will accept small caliber ammunition. Call first to determine if they will accept your materials before handling or transporting.

***Large caliber ordnance, "black powder" or other munitions – Call 911.***

### ➤ Animal Waste

#### *Dog or Cat Waste*

- Place in sealed container or plastic bag and dispose of in regular trash collection.
- Do not place in backyard compost pile.

### ➤ Appliances (which normally contain Freon - non-working)

#### *Air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and refrigerators*

Appliances that contain or once contained Freon, whether there is Freon in the system now or not, are handled separately from regular trash.

- Contact your trash hauler (see yellow pages under "rubbish") to obtain information on the cost and procedure for collection. Some will accept an appliance with Freon, others will take only if the Freon has been properly removed by a certified HVAC technician.

- For certified Freon removal contact a certified refrigeration repair company. Some will provide this service for a fee. See Yellow Pages - "Appliances - Major - Repair" or "Refrigerator & Freezer - Service and Repair."

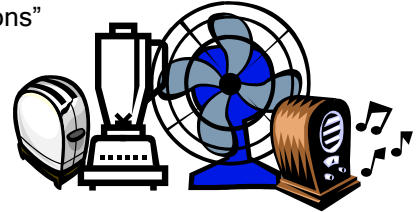

Any contractor should be able to show a certification of having taken Labor and Industry course, plus annual recertification. PADEP suggests that if asbestos is in original condition as when installed (not physically damaged) it does not warrant being removed.

### ***Brake fluid***

- Use up, or See “Household Hazardous Waste.”

### ***Cleaners*** (not solvent based)

- Use up or (if on public sewer service) pour down drain with plenty of water.

### ***Engine cleaner***

- Use up or See “Household Hazardous Waste.” If ingredient TCE (trichloroethylene) or PCE (perchloroethylene) is present, do not use, but save for Household Hazardous Waste collection.

### ***Motor oil*** (used)

- See “Recycling Information Pages” in Verizon Telephone Directory and/or Appendix B or C.
- Contact your local automobile service center.
- Contact major oil retailer.
- Large quantities (greater than 55 gallons) – contact Safety Kleen 215-736-8699

### ***Oil filters*** (used)

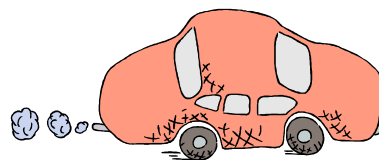

- Wrap in several layers of newspaper and dispose of in regular trash.

### ***Transmission fluid***

- Use up or see “Household Hazardous Waste.”

### ***Wax/polish with solvent base***

- See “Household Hazardous Waste”





## > Batteries

### *Household*



- **Typical household**, non-rechargeable, alkaline, heavy-duty and other dry-cell batteries of the “AAA,” “AA,” “C,” and “D” size

  - ~ If you have large quantities of these batteries you can send them to Battery Solutions, which accepts batteries of all types for recycling. As of November 2004 the fee was - \$.85 per pound, plus shipping.

The company that we work with at our scheduled Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection days are regulated such that they are not permitted to accept material transported to their facility by the public. \*\*Mix **latex paint** with "kitty litter" or other absorbent (vermiculite, shredded newspaper, or shop "oil-dry" absorbent). This can be done in the paint can itself if you have only a quart or so in the can, or in a plastic tray. Mix 2 to 4 cups of absorbent into each quart of paint. After the absorbent has soaked up the paint and it is no longer a liquid, dump it onto a couple of layers of newspaper, wrap it up and place it in a plastic trash bag and dispose of it in your regular waste pick-up. If you mixed the absorbent into the paint right in the can, simply place the open can and its non-liquid contents into a trash bag for disposal.
