# The Planning For The Doylestown Township "Park and Recreation Community Center", Is Finally Underway.

Interest in a recreation center began in 1992, with the Township's Park Recreation Open Space Plan and when we acquired Central Park. The concept was included in the 1993 Central Park Master Plan. The need for indoor recreation space such as a Park Recreation and Community Center has been part of every Park and Open Space plan since.


In 2014, we undertook the planning and renovation of the Doylestown Township administrative offices. New construction of the Township Police and Administration buildings was completed in 2018, the year of our Township Bicentennial. Park and recreation programs were previously held in the "red building" located at the end of the Township parking lot. With the renovation and construction of the administration offices, the red building was converted into workspace for the Public Works Department. Through the process we never lost site of the plan to include indoor space recreation programs and services for the Doylestown Township Community.

Since then, parks and recreation programs continued in the temporary have construction trailers onsite. The trailer space is understandably limited and inadequate, so a review and evaluation of a new recreation center began in earnest. Preliminary concepts for the building, including site location and cost projections were considered by the Board of Supervisors in late 2019 and public comment was engaged that fall as part of our Park and Recreation Open Space Comprehensive Plan update. In early 2020, Doylestown Township issued requests for proposals for consultants to undertake a feasibility study

and architectural design. We chose MKSD architects (this is no acronym – this is what they are called) as the architects and Ballard \* King was selected to undertake the feasibility study. The two entities have been working in tandem and the feasibility study is well underway.

The feasibility study has included market research, data gathering, interviews with stakeholders, focus groups and a public meeting. The conceptual design phase will begin in May. We anticipate that in June 2021, the Board will consider the results of the feasibility study and conceptual designs with a public presentation from our consultants at our regular meeting on June 15th.

We learned through the feasibility study that providing parks and recreation programs is a paramount need and desire for our residents. It is also what Doylestown Township has done well for decades. We begin with the premise that if we build places for our youth to play, be outdoors and learn healthy habits we will have less of a need for juvenile detention facilities. Over the last several years, we have added programs and places for our seniors and residents with special needs and interests.



Our Parks and Recreation Department works to maintain a balance of active and passive programs and services that are designed to include everyone. The Park and Recreation Community Center is a necessary piece of our mission to continue the growth of a healthy community.

We intend the Parks Recreation and Community Center to also provide for emergency services, which we hope will never be needed, but we will be prepared, nonetheless. Think umbrella on a sunny day...

So, stay tuned to upcoming meetings, and we will keep you updated on our communication

platforms, DTV, social media outlets and live web streamed board meetings. And by all means don't hesitate to telephone. We are here to answer your questions and we welcome your suggestions.

By the way, you will also find in this issue of the newsletter the list of Township's special events, the schedule for the Summer Concert Series and the annual golf outing. Please join us in what we have planned.

# Top Five Benefits of a Rain Garden



They provide habitat for pollinators and increase plant diversity.



Attractive and low maintenance to your yard.




Because they help water drain more quickly, rain garden designs reduce mosquito populations.



By positioning a rain garden, at least, 10 feet from your home or other structures and directing rainwater runoff into the rain garden, it is possible to reduce the amount of rain that flows into your basement and toward the sewer. By holding this relatively clean water and allowing it to soak into the ground a rain garden can reduce localized flooding, replenish the local groundwater and improve water quality.

A rain garden is a personal contribution to clean water in your community. Rain gardens are designed to capture rainwater and prevent the rapid release of excess stormwater into municipal water systems. A well-placed rain garden reduces runoff and flooding, and filters pollutants carried in stormwater runoff.

# What Might Be In The Well Water We Drink?

We all love how a cold and fresh glass of our well water is to drink but do we really know what else might be in there. The Township's Septic Management Ordinance requires all residents with on-lot septic systems and private wwells to have their well water tested for E. coli and fecal coliform bacteria every three years. Currently, there is no requirement to have your well water tested for any other potential containment. If you have a private well and are currently connected to public sewer there are no requirements at all for you to have your well water tested. Did you know there are numerous other harmful contaminants that could be in well water? Some of the more common items are nitrates. lead, iron, manganese, detergents, arsenic and possibly PFOA/PFAS.

To determine if your well might have some of these, or other contaminants, we recommend testing your well water. A list of local testing companies and laboratories can be found on the Doylestown Township website 2021-list-of-PHID.pdf (doylestownpa.org).

Unfortunately, the Bucks County Health Department is currently not conducting water testing for E. coli and fecal coliform due to COVID19 restrictions.

The Public Water and Sewer Advisory Board is developing a page for the Doylestown Township Website that will provide additional information on the subject plus links to additional resources from places like Penn State Extension and the US EPA. This page will be updated from time to time as more information becomes available.

We sincerely hope that this information is useful in addressing the safety of your onsite well.



## Get Involved with Bird Town

Did you know that our township is a Bird Town? The Bird Town Program was started in 2010 to build a working partnership between Audubon and municipalities in Pennsylvania to promote conservation and communitybased actions to create healthier and more sustainable habitats for birds and people. Our Township joined the program in 2012 as a joint venture with Doylestown Borough. The Bird Town Program has grown to include 34 different Bird Towns state-wide in over eight counties. Each year, the coordinators meet for an Annual Summit, where they share and report their events and actions taken to educate and raise awareness about the importance of bird-friendly practices, including:

- installing public rain and butterfly gardens,
  renovating park and public spaces by
- removing invasive plants and planting native plants and trees.
- working with their municipal leaders to create native plant ordinances,
- •educating about birdwindow collisions and the reduction of night-time lighting during bird migration.

and people by:

- •working with our township's leaders to establish landscaping and native plant ordinances, offering bird walks,
- •working with local high school students and residents to learn about and remove invasive plants and trees,
- establishing a native plant garden,
- •holding a native plant sale,
- monitoring nearly 40 nesting boxes for Blue Birds,
- •providing educational materials at table events, where we encourage residents to sign up for the Bird-Friendly Habitat Recognition Program and much more.

## Sgt Jones and Ofc. Hannahoe's Quick Thinking Saves a Life

On March 16, 2021 at a Board of Supervisor meeting, Sgt. Robert Jones of the Doylestown Township Police Department and Ofc. Jonathan Hannahoe of the Central Bucks Regional Police Department were awarded the Department Life Saving Award by the Township's Chief of Police Dean Logan.

On February 18, the two officers were on duty when they responded quickly to medical emergency within the Township. On arrival, the resident was unconscious and unresponsive. They immediately initiated life saving measures with use of an Automated External Defibrillator and CPR. Thanks to the two officers' quick and professional actions, the resident came too before the arrival of EMTs and was then safely transported to the hospital for continued care.

Township Chairman of the Board of Supervisors Barbara N. Lyons thanked the officers on the behalf of the board and township. Saying, "You make us proud and we're very grateful for your service and your skills.".

Chief of Police Dean Logan then closed the presentation by commemorating the assistance of the Central Bucks Regional Police Department and their teamwork with the township on the day in question.






