






Big Picture Goal:

To connect Doylestown neighborhoods to the major natural, cultural and commercial resources in the area through a safe walking and/or bicycling network.



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
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
Feedback : Concerns

- All 7 groups were concerned about the safety at the intersections of: Pebble Hill Road x Cherry Lane and Pebble Hill Road x Turk Road.
- Concerns were mainly about sight distance and speed.
- 5 of the 7 groups were concerned about speed, drainage, hills, and hazardous conditions along Pebble Hill Road / Green
- 2 of the 7 groups were concerned about shoveling the new paths / sidewalks

Feedback : Support

- 5 of the 7 groups favored Woodview Drive as an alternative to Turk Road
- 4 of the 7 groups would like to utilize Buck Run (Neshaminy Creek Tributary) to connect to the borough
- 3 of the 7 groups think that Turk road, Cherry lane and Pebble Hill are the most direct routes and therefore should be explored as options
- 2 of the 7 groups want to see biking / walking paths along Cherry lane














Green Street – Meadow Lane to Country Club (1300')

- Continue existing Green St. concept to end of Borough /Country Club property
- Stripe parking lane from Hillside to Meadow (exist. sidewalk here already)
- Move east curb into road minimize impacts
- Create 10'-11' lanes and 8' area for sidewalk/ ornamental lighting or bike and hike path
- Colorized/textured intersections & crosswalks








Bridge south of Bypass (downstream) – approx. 40' bridge needed

Pebble Hill Road


- - Asphalt bike & hike path on Country Club property

 - Curb, bike & hike path and small retaining wall from Turk Rd. to Cherry Lane; Pebble Valley to Woodview Dr.























Turk Road

- Pros
 - Direct Route
- 25 mph


<u>Cons</u>

- 19' existing cartway (Varies 33'-41.5' ROW)
- Steep existing slopes
- Hills along Turk Rd cause poor vertical sight distance
- Intersection with Pebble Hill has poor horizontal sight distance
- Utility Poles














Option 1 – 4' asphalt sidewalk with sharrows




Option 2 - Curb, 4' concrete sidewalk in roadway with sharrows, narrow lanes




Turk Road Neighborhood (Pebble Woods, Woodview, Pebble Valley)

- Connect to Existing Trail along Turk Road with a side path or share the road
- Avoid Turk Road due to limited right of way, vertical sight distance, high vehicular speeds, large cut sections, utility poles
- Utilize Pebble Wood, Woodview, and Pebble Valley because of ample public right-of-way, low speed, low stress for bicycles/pedestrians
- Paint Sharrows on the roadway to help direct cyclists while also alerting motorists of the cyclist's presence
- Optional walking path / sidewalk if the community favors that option




Cherry Lane Neighborhood (Cherry, Springs, East)

- Future Land Development Brooks Tract building Shared Use Path
- Utilize Springs Drive because of ample public right-of-way (50'), low speed, low stress for bicycles/pedestrians
- Paint Sharrows on the roadway to help direct cyclists while also alerting motorists of the cyclist's presence
- Optional walking path / sidewalk if the community favors that option
- Shared Use Path on East Road. Midblock Crossing after Pond Use shoulder of 202 bridge (~12' wide) with potential buffer/flex posts
- Tie into existing trail 200 feet north of structure.




East Road to Cultural District / Main St.

- Existing trails thru Farm Ln / Chapman Park
- Proposed Trail along E .State St to avoid sharing narrow driveway and back tracking
- Proposed trail along Boro Mill Hill Rd.
- Use sidewalk and shoulders on E. State St. (improve with striping/signs/crosswalks
- Use Ashland St. sidewalk and sharrows to reach Main Street
- Existing trail off Church St. to reach Library
