### **Cycling Education and Safety**

- Bruce Hochman is a Cyclist Educator, Ride Leader, and Cycling Instructor.
- He has presented numerous programs such as Smart Cycling Traffic Skills, Teens and Adults Need to Know, Instructional Biking, and has led a Kids Bike Derby. He is active in the Doylestown Y, and mentioned that they have applied for an educational grant from the Bicycle Club.
- Bruce shared materials from various sources, and a booklet of power points from the League of American Bicyclists

### **Additional Items**

- Phil Ehlinger stated that Doylestown Borough had purchased a template for a Sharrow, a shared lane arrow, which will be painted on the roads near Linden school, West St. and Green St. The purpose is to indicate to drivers that there are cyclists on the road and will help reduce wrong-way bicycling.
- Lynn Goldman requested that one be painted on a road so that the Committee and other municipalities could see it.
- Louise Silberg stated that a grant had been received by Buckingham for a park and connection between Furlong and Holicong.
- CB Cares will be promoting Bike to School Day. Marilyn Jacobson mentioned that Chalfont, New Britain Borough and Township had conducted a Walk to School Day. Andy Hamilton stated that PA Walks and Bikes has \$22 million not spent. They are open to projects of \$250,000 or larger with several municipalities involved.
- There will be a Ride of Silence on May 11 at 7pm from CB West to remember those who have been killed in bicycling accidents.
