Meeting Notes – February 4, 2013

Introduction

Kathy Brown welcomed all attendees. Each member introduced themselves.

Election of Officers

Election of Officers was tabled until the March meeting pending appointment of additional members.

Roles and Responsibilities

Kathy Brown suggested that a primary responsibility of the board would be to educate and inform. She noted that this should include both members as well as the general public.

Greg Hayes suggested an article about the dog park providing a synopsis from inception to reality.
