Mr. Glassman called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. A quorum was present and the following matters were discussed:

- 1. Reorganization was deferred to Feb 23 meeting.
- 2. Auditor is working on Act 205 actuarial report on Pension Plan conditions due mid-Spring. Early look indicates the Township did better than the 8% return assumption.
- 3. Ed will present annual update at BOS meeting 02/15.
- 4. Mark focused on the points of his kick-off meeting e-mail
 - 1. Reconciliation to audit report
 - a. Tie out opening 2010 balances
 - b. Update fund balance reporting
 - 2. Capital expenditures framework
 - a. Rationalize scope of work in relation to current staffing levels (how do we estimate capacity to perform capital projects)
 - b. Focus on "clearing the decks" in 2011/2012 (remove backlog)
 - 3. Pension (re) evaluation
 - a. Assess impact of January 2011 report
 - b. Funding approach
 - 4. Analyze comparative data
 - a. Staffing levels and costs
 - b. Key metrics
 - 5. Millage (re)alignment
 - Align millage with related costs
 - b. Find way to communicate the effect of budget changes to millage
 - c. Possibly convert EIT into equivalent millage
 - 6. Cost and revenue considerations
 - a. Cost containment or reductions
 - b. New revenue sources
 - 7. Update 3-year forecast
- 5. Mark distributed his "4 segments" for purposes of rationalizing millage allocation and understanding how the cost structure influences taxes
 - Safety and Emergency

- Infrastructure
- Administration
- Capital Financing

Lee suggested we make Parks and Recreation a fifth segment because of its prominence in budget discussions

Ed stated that accounting system codes permit grouping data per Mark's proposal, which should facilitate the process.

- 6. The committee will seek ways to provide information during the year to the public, such as a glossary of commonly used terms, perhaps via the Township's website and quarterly newsletter.
 - Sandra stated that up to 2 pages are available for Ways and Means material in summer and fall newletter issues. April 10 is the deadline for the summer issue.
- 7. Reviewed preliminary spreadsheets for 2011. Agreed that Offsite Fund and Highway Debt Fund would move from unrestricted to restricted classification on the spreadsheet.
- 8. Ken is working on cleaning up a lot of old A/R and A/P transactions that are distorting reporting. Could not project when it would be finished
