Chairman's Message-We're getting there!

It all started in the mid-nineties at the founding of Central Park, when the dream for a community recreation center was first imagined. In 2018, the Township's new administration and police department facility was built and the planning for the recreation center got underway. It began with a vote of the Board, then a feasibility study, along with many discussions among the Supervisors and the community. Now with architectural renderings and construction documents completed, the Township is looking to go to bid this summer with construction to begin this Fall.

There are some questions still under consideration, but we are heading to a ribbon cutting in late 2024 to coincide with the 30th Anniversary of Central Park.

The Parks and Recreation Community Center (PRCC) will be situated on the site now housing the trailers and the sport courts. The sport courts, (basketball, tennis, bocce ball and pickle ball) will be relocated to Field 1 along with additional parking. In addition to the PRCC, we will be building bathrooms to serve the Amphitheater and Kid's Castle.

The 18,000 square foot facility will contain three multi-purpose rooms that can be reconfigured into one large room. We envision these spaces, each available to rent, to be in high demand for kids' parties, family events, business meetings, and programming for all ages.

A kitchen nearby will be available to service the events and host cooking classes. An outdoor patio that can be closed to the elements with large garage style doors will have a cozy fireplace and provide a beautiful space for special events and the ever-popular dog training classes.

The main feature of the Center is a large gymnasium that will accommodate basketball, volleyball and pickleball with room for spectators. The gym can also be subdivided with a rolling curtain suspended from the ceiling. This space will also serve as a location to host large events like craft fairs.

The cost is estimated at \$11 million, which we intend to fund with a bond, grants, and a capital fundraising campaign. The capital campaign, which has a goal of \$3 million, will soon be underway. We have already received \$1.5 million in grants, thanks to State Senator Steve Santarsiero.

Electric Vehicle Charging in Doylestown

As our country and our Township act to address the issues of global climate change, we are already seeing an active transition from gasoline to electric powered vehicles (EVs). We now have electric cars, SUVs and trucks coming from all the major car-makers, including Ford, General Motors, Kia, Hyundai, VW and so many others, as well as Tesla. EVs have many advantages: no tailpipe emissions and no noise, outstanding performance, lower fuel costs and very little maintenance. The only real limitation now is the charging infrastructure. Where do we plug in?

Currently there aren't the number of charging locations that we will need for the future. The good news is, we already have quite a few. Most people will do most charging at home (overnight) or at the workplace or a commuter location when the vehicle is not in use. Beyond this, we will need charging locations at public places like shopping centers and recreation areas, and along interstate highways to enable longer trips.

You may have noticed that Doylestown Township now has 2 electric vehicle chargers in the parking lot near the Administration Building. These are available to the public, and anyone with an EV can charge at a very modest fee. So how does this work?

Just as there are different brands of gasoline, there are also several companies providing chargers, and like brands of gasoline, they are all very comparable. The Township has installed a Chargepoint charger. Other common providers

include Blink, EV Connect and EVgo. Tesla has its own private network of chargers, and these only work with Tesla vehicles (for now).

As shown in the chart to the right, there are different 'levels' of charging. More voltage means faster charging, but Level 2 charging is most common.

EV charging is easy. Unlike fueling with gasoline, you will not pay at 'the pump'. You must first download the providers 'app', set up an account and register a means of payment



(usually a credit card). When you arrive at the charger, you will tap your phone to the charger, plug in and charge. The app will keep a record of your purchase. You should move your vehicle as soon as charging is completed.

Finding chargers is also easy. Almost all chargers are linked to the internet, and your car's navigation system will find the nearest one or plan your route to include a charging stop, if necessary. There are also many apps that can help you locate an EV charging location.

Think on how quickly we transition from typewriters to desktop computers, from heavy CRT televisions to flatscreen Hi-Def televisions, and from clunky 'car-phones' to sleek smartphones. Would you ever go back? In the same way, EVs will be the future of driving, and we encourage you to learn more about them at www.electricforall.org. •

Septic Pumping, Well Water Testing, and Public Sewer & Water Connection Information

Attention Doylestown Township Residents who have septic systems and well water - You need to pump your septic systems and test your well water every three years, which is required by Township Ordinance.

Here is some important information regarding this requirement:

- Reminders for properties due in 2023 have been sent out! If you are due in 2023, please make sure you submit your water test result and pumper report (see photo to the right for what the report looks like) to the Township.
- Reminders have been sent out for properties that are past due for these requirements. You will have until July 31st to submit the necessary water test result and/ or pumper report to the Township. After this time frame, failure to comply with this requirement could result in fines and legal action.
- If you are connected to public sewer but <u>not</u> public water, you will no longer need to have your water tested. If you receive any reminders about pumping your septic system or testing your water, please contact the Township so your record can be updated to reflect that you have public sewer.
- If you are connected to public water but <u>not</u> public sewer, water testing is no longer required. However, your septic system will need to be pumped every three years. If you receive any reminders about water testing, please contact the Township so your record can be updated to reflect that you have public water.

Please also note that Bucks-Mont Environmental LLC is no longer an approved pumper/hauler for Doylestown Township. - For the approved list of pumper/haulers and water test facilities for the Township, please visit our septic management page on our website.

Public Water and Sewer Connections:

If you are looking to connect to public water and/or sewer, please make sure you contact the Township to learn more about the process to connect and if public water and sewer services are available in your area. Permits and inspections are required. Annual Fire Hydrant Flushing and Maintenance Program

From April to June the DTMA will conduct its annual fire hydrant flushing and maintenance program. Annual flushing of the DTMA distribution system helps to improve the water quality by removing any sediment that may accumulate in the pipes. In addition, the fire hydrants are inspected and maintained to ensure proper operation for our local fire departments during fire emergencies. Hydrants are flushed between the hours of 6:30 am to 3:30 pm.

Customers may experience discolored water or low pressure when flushing takes place close to your home or business. If this occurs, please run the water for a few minutes until the water is clear.

DTMA utilizes an automated software program to notify when flushing will be nearby. Please visit the DTMA website at

Ahrens "Fox" (DFC Engine 19-3) 100 Year Anniversary!

The Doylestown Fire Company (DFC) is celebrating the 100th year anniversary of its classic fire truck, the Ahrens "Fox" Pumper. The "Fox" Pumper was purchased from the Ahrens Fox Company of Cincinnati, Ohio in June, 1923 at a cost of \$13,400. It was commissioned for service to the Doylestown community in December 1923.

DFC's "Fox," along with a twin 1923 Fox destined for service by the Lambertville, New Jersey Fire Company, were shipped via the Reading Railroad to Doylestown in October, 1923. DFC's "Fox" served as a key firefighting apparatus protecting the Doylestown Community for over 50 Years, with its last fire response being the fire at the old Borough School on February 23, 1973.

Although the "Fox" remains operable today, with a 1,000 Gallons per minute pumping capability, it is currently relegated for deployment at special community events.

Throughout 2023, DFC is recognizing this milestone anniversary with the display of the Fox at various public events, commencing with their Pancake Breakfast which was held on March 18th, the Memorial Day Parade, the July 15th Dusk to Dawn car show, October Fire Prevention Open House and Santa's Doylestown arrival. A special Mercer "Fox" tile has been commissioned and will be available for purchase.

Doylestown Township - 2023 Budget

The Doylestown Township budget reflects the goals developed by the Board of Supervisors and serves as a financial plan and as a tool for accountability. As the budget process demonstrates, the plan was developed over multiple months and public meetings.

While maintaining current services the Board of Supervisors has four main goals for 2023:

- **1.** Continued accelerated maintenance on the Township's 77 miles of roads.
- Parks upgrade construction projects including a new Community Recreation Center, reconstructed Basketball/Tennis/Pickleball courts, revitalized Bocce Courts, and construction of public bathrooms in the vicinity of the Amphitheater and Kids Castle in response to residents expressed desires.
- **3.** Ensuring an appropriate level of funding for future Township pension obligations.
- **4.** Provide funding for desired future Capital projects.








Township Budget Process-2023 Schedule of Events

2023 Budget At a Glance

The *balanced 2023 budget* for Doylestown Township focuses on three main elements: Capital Spending, Operating Revenue, and Operating Expenses.





There is increased capital spending in 2023 largely for the Parks Community Center projects. **Grants and Fundraising** will help to offset this spending, with the balance obtained from bond borrowing and fund reserves.

2022 vs. 2023 Operations Graphs



How This Affects Our Residents

The Board of Supervisors always strives to minimize costs where possible and to be fiscally responsible. In comparison to other municipalities, Doylestown Township remains competitive. The 2023 tax rate (which is the same rate as 2022) of Doylestown Township is in the middle of Bucks County municipalities.



Final Notes

The Board of Supervisors formally adopted the 2023 budget at their December 20, 2022 Board of Supervisors meeting. The Budget Book, which is available for review on the Township's website, includes forecasts of expected 2022 financial results, the 2023 Adopted Budget, and projections of future budgets from 2024 through 2027. Budget forecasting has been completed through 2027 to identify the budget priorities and bring fund balances to the Board of Supervisors goals. The budget was formulated with collaboration between the Township's Board of Supervisors, the Township manager, Department Heads and the Finance staff, and the Finance Committee.


